- 535 students responded

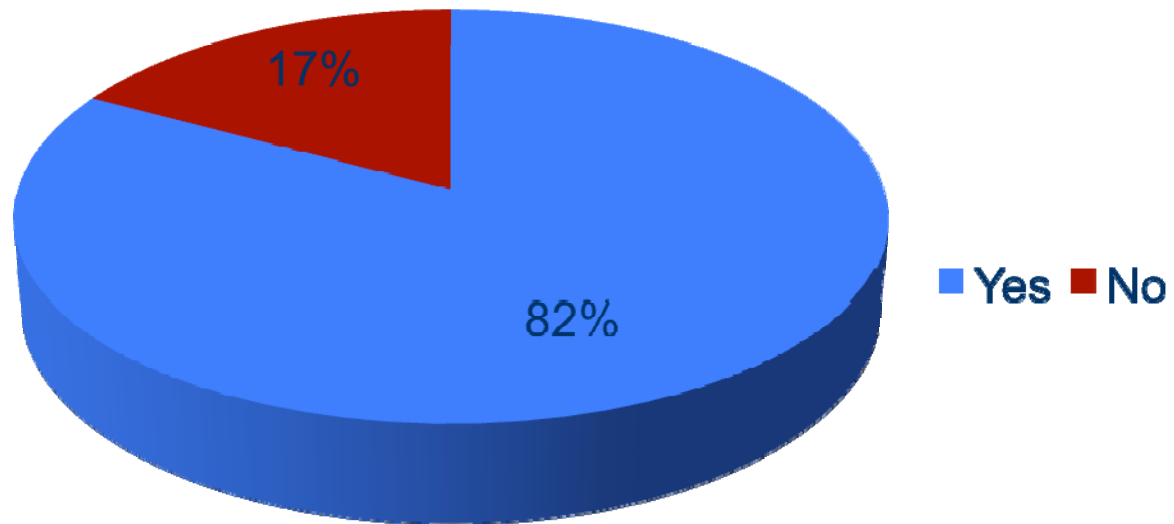


Renaissance Card program

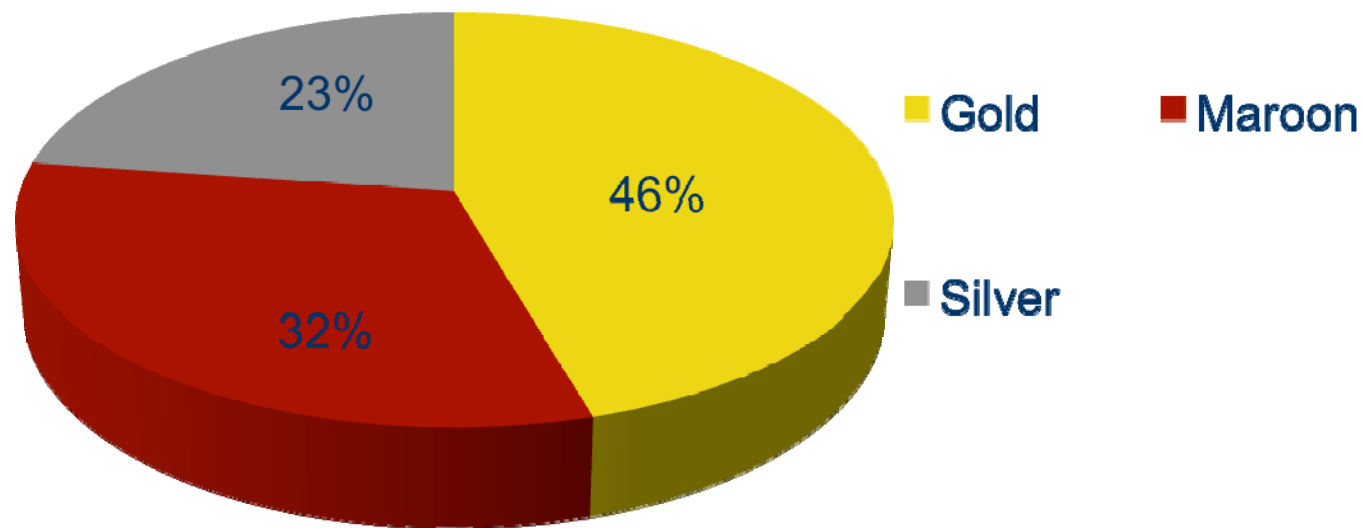
- “stop wasting the school’s money on renaissance prizes...money would be more wisely spent/invested in science wing improvements than in renaissance prizes”

- “I like the rewards”



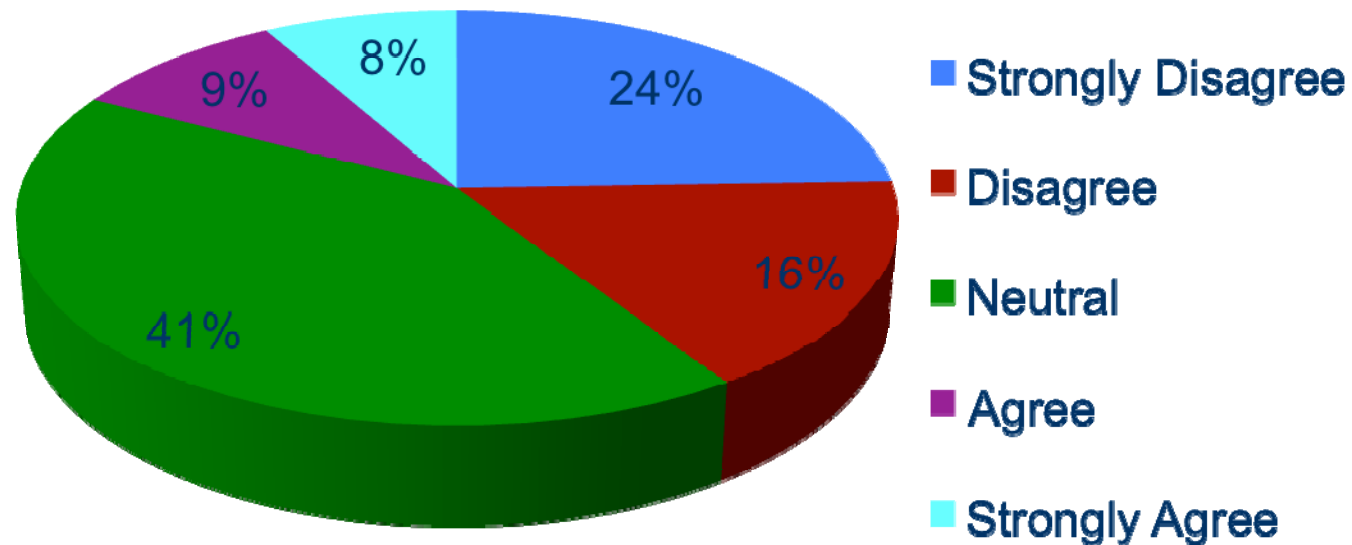
Do you have a Renaissance Card?



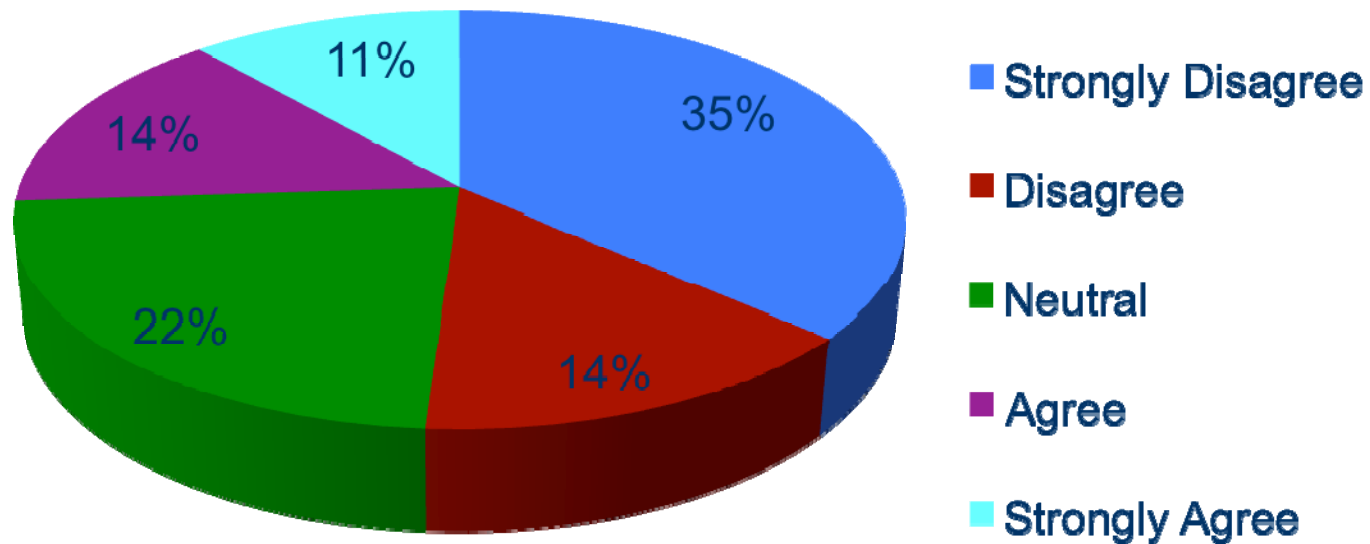
If yes, what color card do you have?



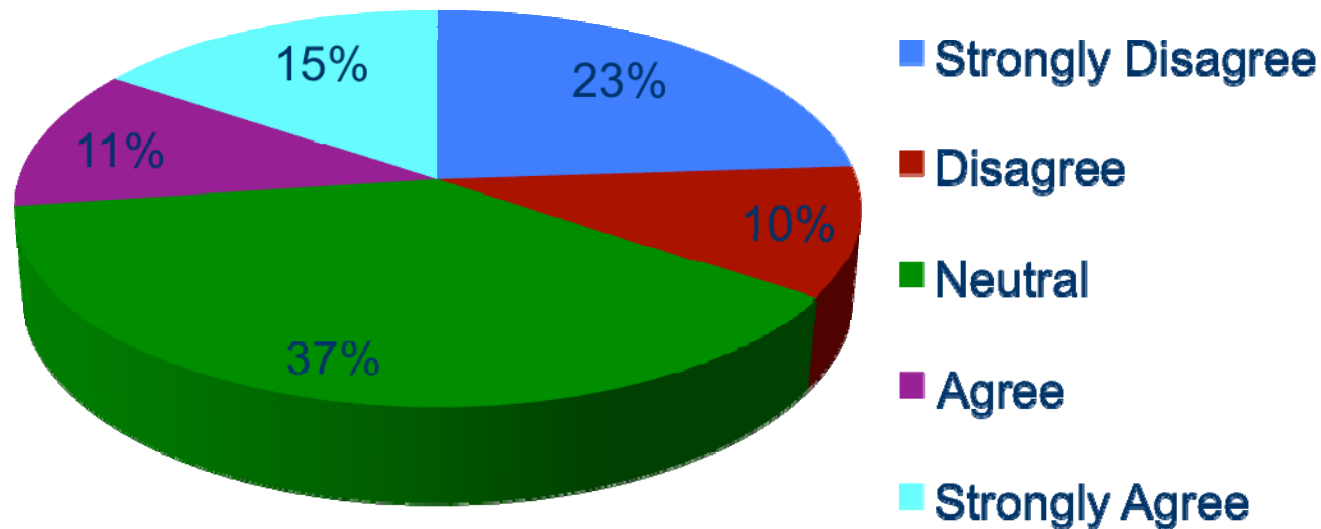
The Renaissance card program has encouraged me to improve my grades

I like the prize drawings for Renaissance card holders.

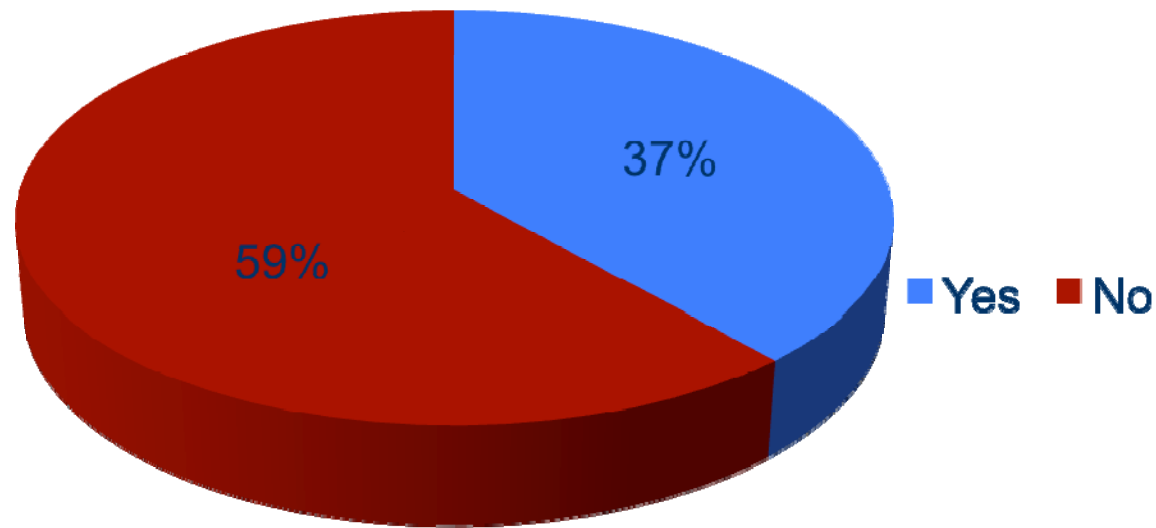


Pride Time/Pride Rewards

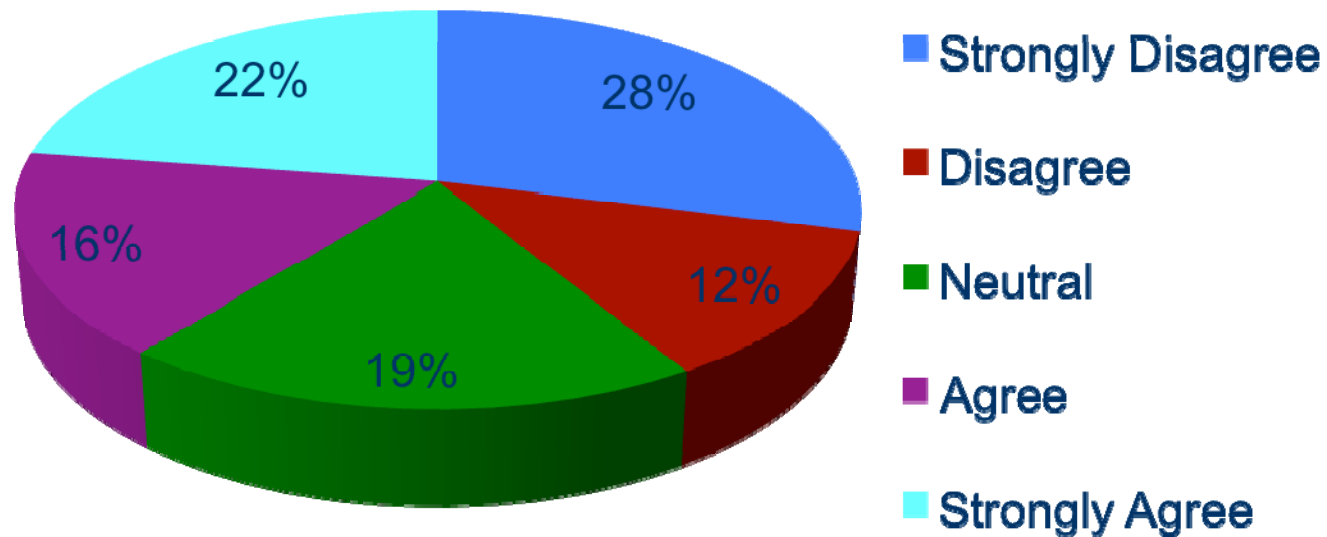
- “tutoring should be for any students who want it”

- “Pride time needs a lot better rewards to get better grades”



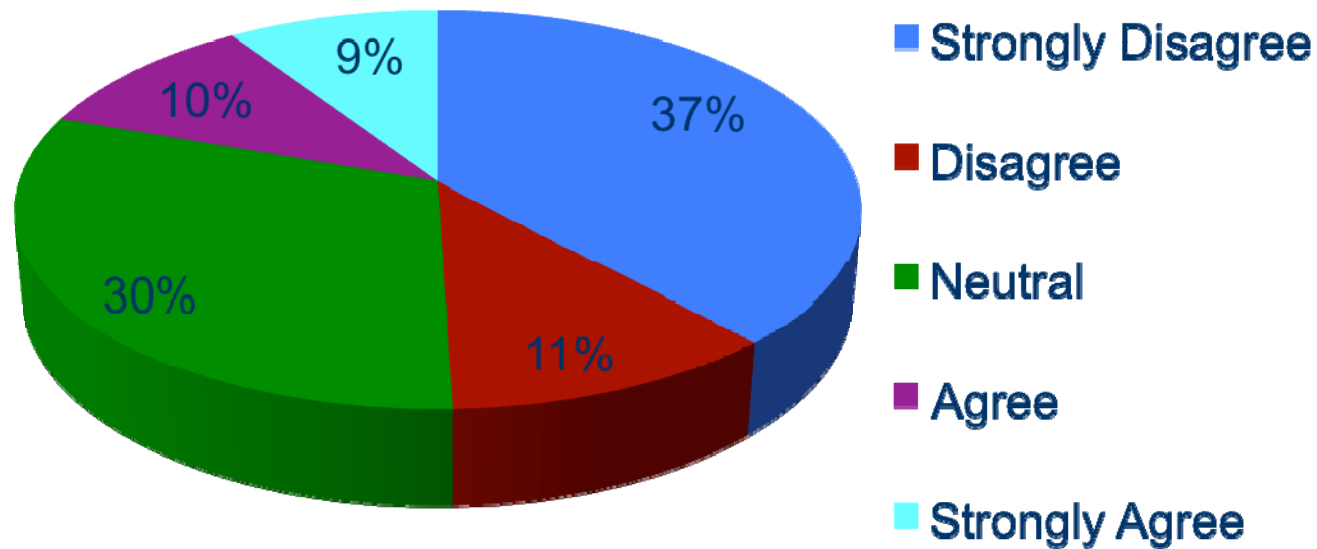
Are you currently eligible for Pride Rewards?



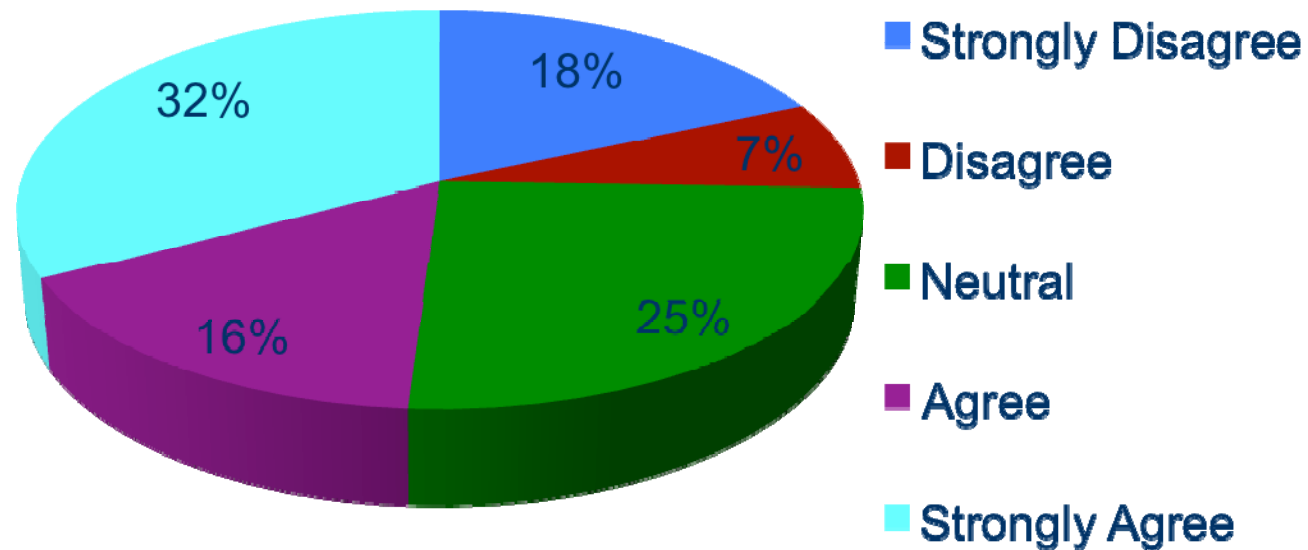
Pride time has reduced my homework load.



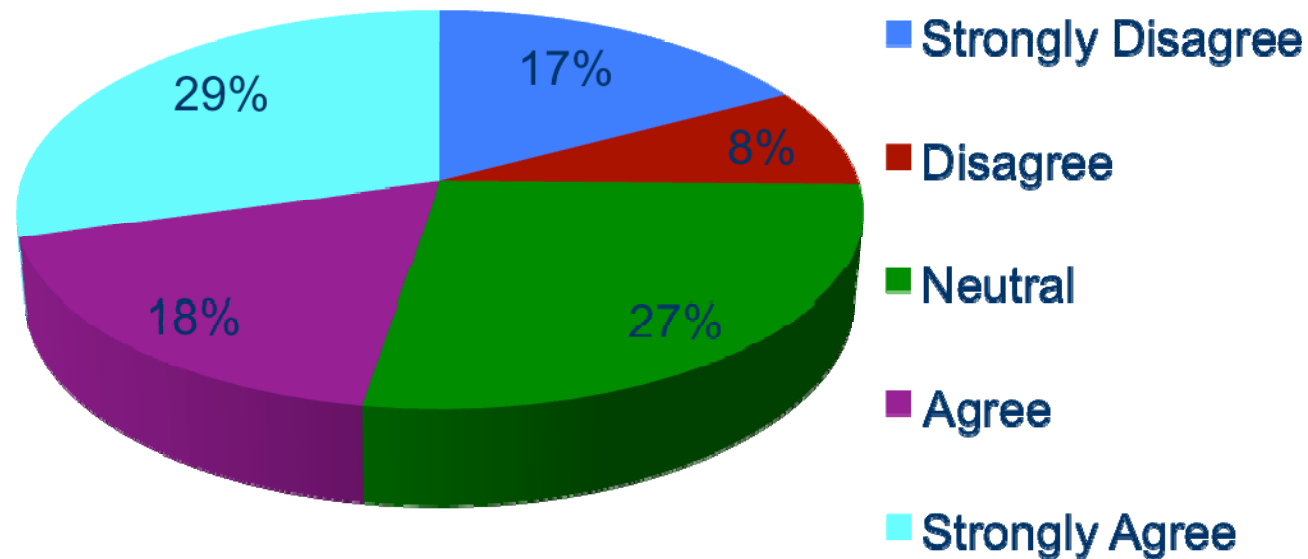
Pride Rewards has lessened my stress at school.

Remodeling the current science classrooms and constructing new classrooms/labs will improve the quality of science classes at RHS.

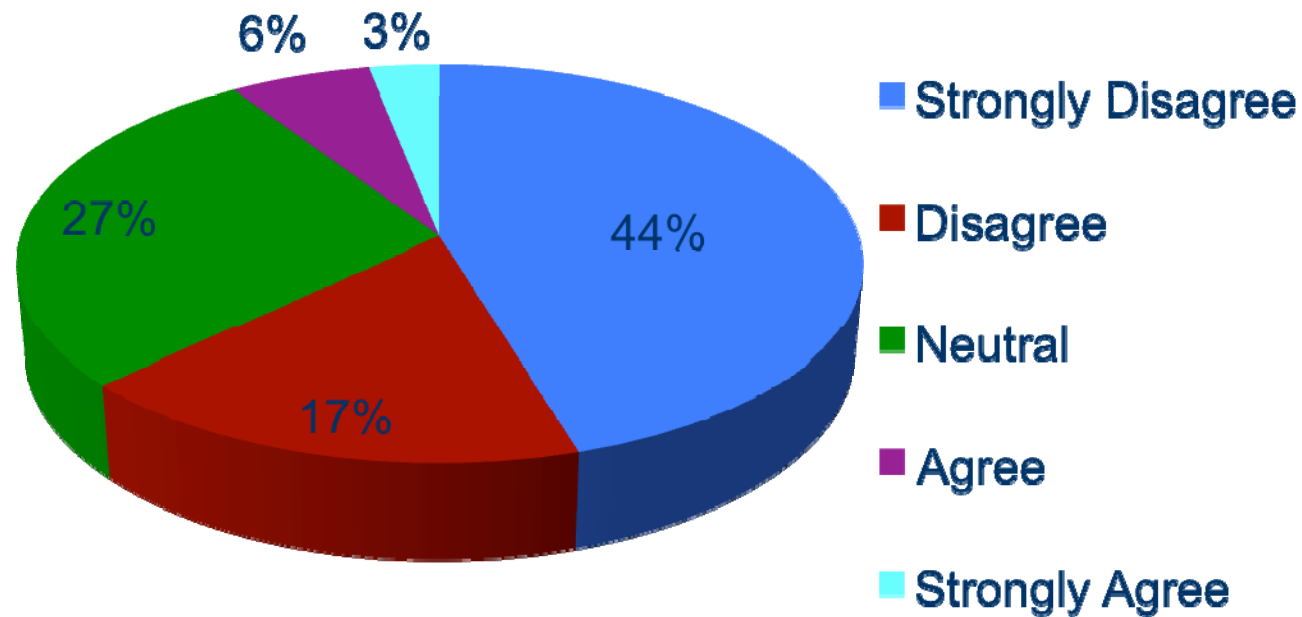


The Bulldog Code

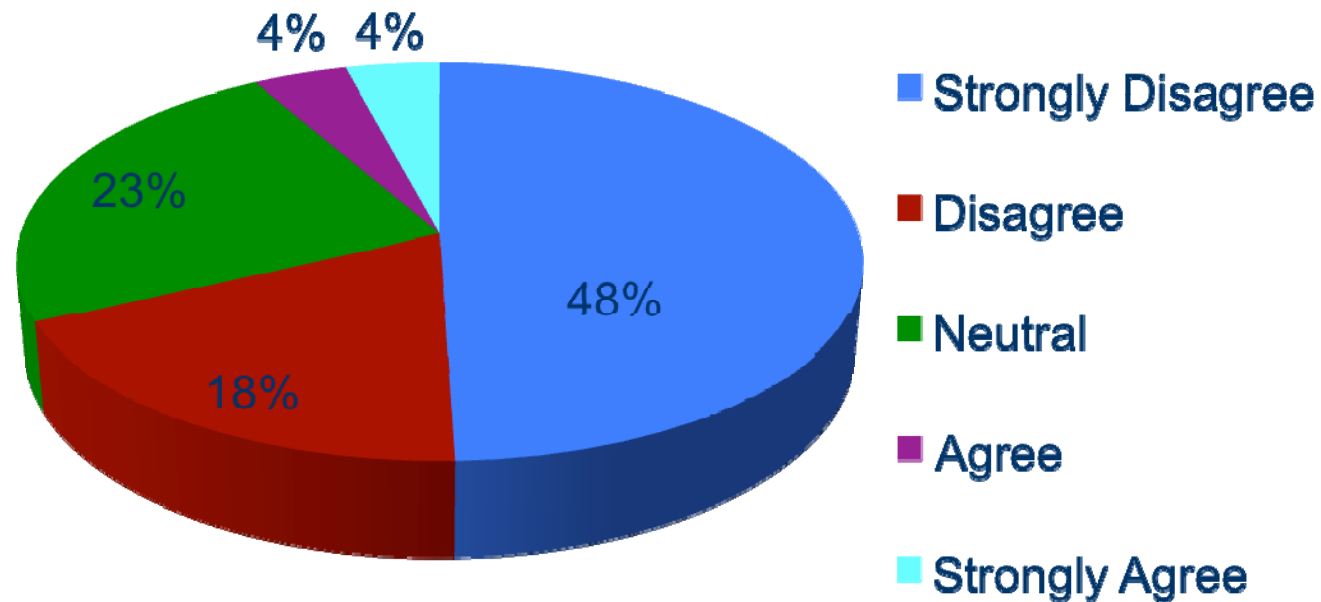
- “Bulldog bucks should not be rewarded for expected behavior”

The introduction of the Bulldog code has improved the atmosphere at RHS.

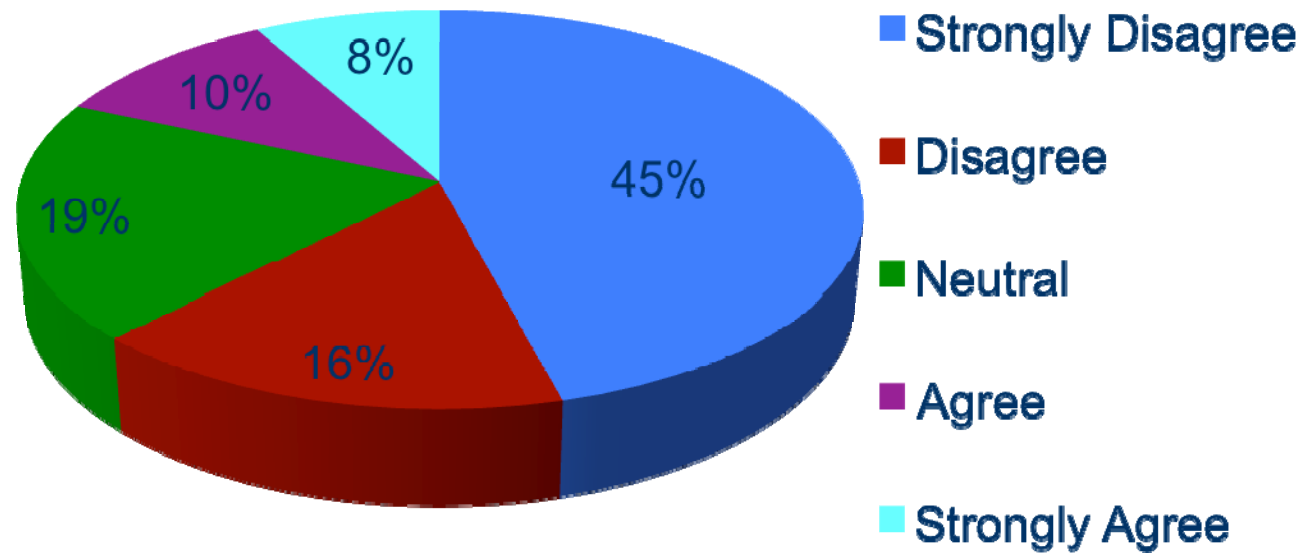


Tardy sweeps

The tardy sweep is an effective tool for reducing classroom disruptions.

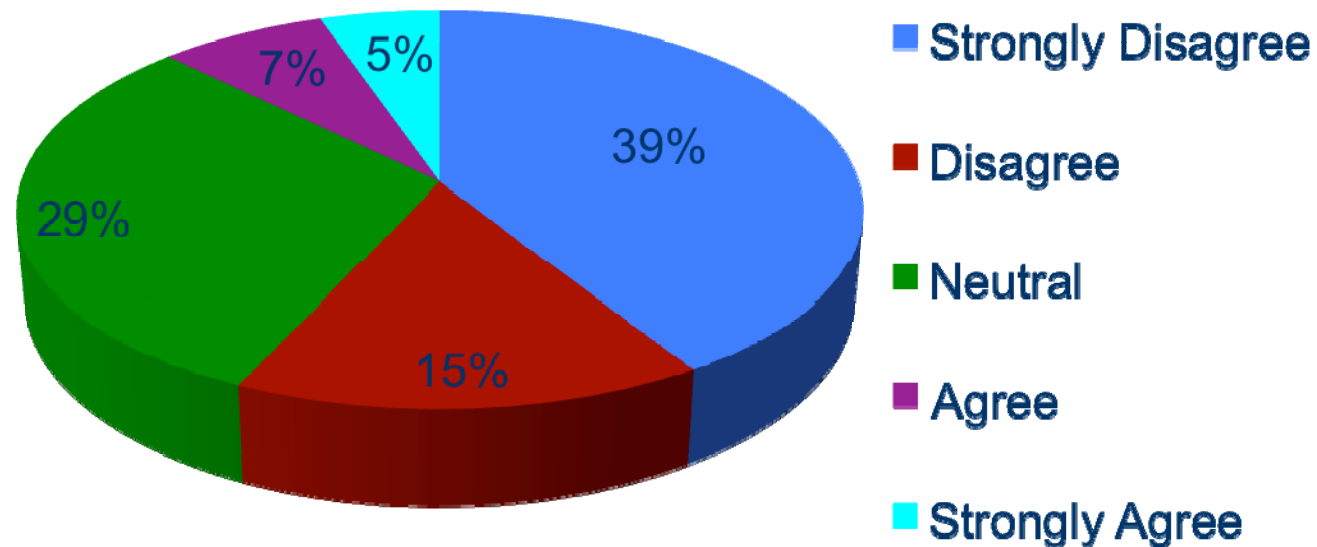


Drug-Free measures
